Facilities


Cafe - At Inglesport

What to Bring for Climbing

We will we exposed to the weather for much of the day, please bring;



Waterproof tops and bottoms - we can lend you some but please tell us before hand

A jumper - it can get chilly when exposed at the top

Change for parking

Sun protection - hat, sunglasses and suncream

A water bottle

What to Bring for Caving

We will we exposed to the weather for much of the day, please bring:

A complete head to toe change of clothes - Arrive in the clothes you are happy with getting wet and dirty

Shoes that grip well and protect your toes - we cannot take you caving if you only have crocs, sandals, canvas shoes or other shoes which could result in harm. Even better contact us to bring a pair of wellies in your size (sometimes wellies don't fit though so still bring some suitable shoes if you can)

Waterproof tops and bottoms - we can lend you some but please tell us before hand - we will bring a suit for you to wear underground but you'll not want to be wearing this all the time

A jumper - it can get chilly

Change for parking

Sun protection - hat, sunglasses and suncream

A water bottle
